Volunteer!

Thank you for your interest in the Santa Barbara Museum of Art's **Teaching Assistant (TA) Program!** TA positions are for 15 - 18 year olds interested in art and/or working with children. Our TA positions are on a volunteer basis and count toward required community service hours. TAs assist students and Teaching Artists during art camps held at the Museum's Ridley-Tree Education Center (RTEC), a studio art education facility.

Description of Program

During summer break we offer week-long Ceramics and ArtVenture (AVC) Camps with a variety of activities including painting, drawing, collage, printmaking, and sculpture, structured around a specific theme.

Teaching Assistant (TA) positions are for 15-18 year olds interested in art and working with children during these camps at the RTEC. The site offers camps for students ages 5-12 in an atmosphere where creativity, studio art practices, and fun create an enriching experience.

TAs are responsible for assisting the Teaching Artist in the classroom, preparing materials, and helping children with hands-on art making. For summer camp, the minimum volunteer commitment is two weeks and is equivalent to 80 hours of community service credit.

Becoming a TA provides young artists with professional skills in art making and art education. This competitive program includes an orientation, Museum tour, mentoring by a Teaching Artist, and Studio Hours (available upon request). TAs walk away with a solid relationship with the Museum, teaching skills, new art techniques, and more.

TA COMMITMENT IS A MINIMUM OF TWO (2) WEEKS

AVC Camp, 8 am - 4 pm (40 hours of Community Service per week) Ceramics Camp, 8 am - 4 pm (40 hours of Community Service per week)

Orientation and Museum Tour

Students new to the TA Program are required to attend an orientation held at the Museum and the RTEC. A short introduction and PowerPoint presentation provide an overview of the commitments, followed by tours of the Museum and the RTEC building and classrooms. TAs learn about the current exhibitions students will be studying, the location of art materials, first aid equipment, and more.

All TAs, new and returning, are encouraged to attend the Museum tour on the current exhibitions that will be used for the summer art projects.

Studio Hours

Available upon request, accepted TAs have access to after-hours studio time at the RTEC. From 3:30 to 5 pm, TAs can work on a new project, develop new techniques learned at camp, or explore a favorite medium! Fine art materials, instruction, art making, and portfolio critique are included, with guidance from a Teaching Artist.

ArtVenture Camps

Garden Party: Digging into Sustainability

June 15 – 19 July 27 – 31 Nature has always been a source of inspiration for artists by providing beauty, fresh air, and nourishment. How can we give back to nature as artists? By digging into the concept of sustainability, as well as the dirt in our gardens, campers become garden architects for the week, designing structures, vessels, and plant beds while gaining appreciation for the natural environment.

Animals in the House: Creatures of SBMA

June 22 – 26 August 3 – 7 What do Europe, the Americas, Asia, and Ancient Greece have in common? They all have their own unique species of animals! Find inspiration in the ways artists have drawn, painted, and sculpted animals across the world and through the ages. Gather together the mythical stories of animals' special powers and illustrate your own using calligraphy, clay, printmaking, and more.

A Common Thread: Fibers and Textiles

July 6 - 10 August 10 - 14 Through the tactile medium of fibers and textiles, investigate form, function, and fashion—all while making a personal statement. Gaining inspiration from the headdresses, armor, and kimonos in the Museum's collection, campers design and construct their own wearable masterpieces.

The Next Dimension: 2D to 3D

July 13 – 17 August 17 – 21 Discover the ways in which line, shape, and color provide a launching pad for creativity in an expansive array of mediums. Inspired by the exhibition *The Paintings of Moholy-Nagy: The Shape of Things to Come*, campers move seamlessly from pencil, paint, and collage to constructions of wood, metal, and plastic—with some modern technology added for good measure.

Back to the Drawing Board: Getting from Here to There

July 20 – 24

All artwork begins with an idea. How does that idea become a reality? Investigate ways to bring that idea to life, moving from the tiniest drawing to large-scale works. Experiment with a variety of both classic and unexpected drawing tools and techniques, finding ways to give form to ideas using both refined and wild styles.
